2021 CVNHP Internship Grants

- Adirondack Experience: Adirondack Experience Library Ephemera and Oral History Processing Internship. The Adirondack Experience Library will hire an intern for 8 weeks during its 2021 open season (May–October) to process historical ephemera collections and oral history interviews that document life, industry, and development in the Adirondack Park and its immediate environs, including portions of the Champlain Valley. (\$5,000)
- The fort will host a maritime trade's intern to work with museum staff to develop and present public hands-on carpentry programs relating to the museum's growing maritime program. (\$5,000)
- **St Albans Museum: Education Fellowship.** The museum will provide an intensive summer professional development/internship opportunity in public history and museum studies, focused around educational programming, exhibit design, historic site management, and community engagement & outreach. (\$5,000)

2021 CVNHP Collections Grants

- Musée Missisquoi Museum: UV Window Filtering Film and LED Lighting for the Missisquoi Museum. The museum will install UV window filters and improved lighting for the long-term preservation of artifacts. (\$7,500)
- Essex County Historical Society: Adirondack History Museum UV/Climate Control. The project will implement climate control in three collection storage rooms at the Adirondack History Museum. Temperature and humidity stabilization are pertinent for the increased longevity and preservation of our archive, photograph, object, and textile collections. (\$7,500)
- Clinton County Historical Association: Project to Replace Windows. The Clinton County Historical Association is committed to keeping its 115 year old building fit for visitors and secure for housing exhibits and artifacts by replacing over time the 35 aging and damaged windows which have no UV protection and show serious signs of deterioration causing a great concern for the safety and security of its collection. This grant will help support that commitment. (\$4,400)
- William H. Miner Agricultural Research Institute: Renewal of the Heart's Delight Farm Heritage Exhibit Wayside Walk. The wayside walk panels on Miner Institute's historic Heart's Delight Farm Wayside Walk and Gardens will be redesigned to incorporate new images and technology. (\$3,420)
- Samuel de Champlain History Center: Cataloging the Champlain Quadricentennial. This project will inventory, catalog, rehouse and ensure the continued preservation and accessibility of the materials in the History Center collection relating to the Champlain Quadricentennial Celebration in 2009 and relatedly acquired materials on former Champlain commemorations. (\$4,000)

- Rokeby Museum: Rokeby Museum Collections Storage Upgrade. New storage supplies, shelving, and collections care equipment for storage and preservation of textile, object and paper artifacts documenting life in 18th-20th century Vermont. (\$7,500)
- Lake Champlain Maritime Museum: Internship in Nautical Archaeology, Historic Preservation, and Photogrammetry. The museum's 2021 internship is designed to develop the intern's knowledge and experience in nautical archaeology, historic preservation, and public interpretation by providing real-world experience in its Nautical Archaeology Center Conversation Lab. (\$5,000)

2021 CVNHP Local Heritage Grants

- Fort Ticonderoga Association: Fostering Historical Thinking in Students from the North Country and Beyond. The fort will expand participation by teachers and students in North Country History Day for the 2020-2021 School Year and connect students from across the country participating in National History Day with Ticonderoga resources. (\$7,500)
- Big Heavy World: Youth Radio Program Exploring Modernization of Historic Vermont Teen Center Model. High school students will learn production and journalism skills to create a researched radio program about how contemporary youth can modernize youth-led programming at a historically youth-led Burlington performing arts venue. (\$4,000)
- SUNY Plattsburgh: Piloting and Assessing Live Placemaking. The college will conduct live storytelling events to build community and promote understanding around complex natural heritage and social-ecological challenges in New York's Lake Champlain Basin. They will conduct evaluation to understand the applicability of storytelling for encouraging environmental stewardship. (\$7,500)
- Rokeby Museum: Cultural & Natural History Interpretive Trails Project. Students in grades 9-12 in Rokeby's home school district will participate in this place-based multi-disciplinary education project, with the assistance of museum staff and volunteer specialists, to develop new outdoor interpretive signage and trail infrastructure upgrades to the museum's interpretive trail "How Does a Farm Become a Forest?" (\$4,000)

2021 CVNHP Interpretive Theme Grants

- The CLD will develop an audio-guided tour that will have visitors discover the people and places that marked the prohibition period which involved the Eastern Townships and Vermont. (\$7,500)
- Lake Champlain Maritime Museum: "Destroy the Cargo!": Prohibition Smuggling on Lake Champlain. "Destroy the Cargo!" will be a new exhibit and digital interactive at Lake Champlain Maritime Museum showcasing the important role that Lake Champlain played in smuggling alcohol from Canada into the United States during federal prohibition (\$7,500)

- Vermont Folklife Center: Temperance, One Day at a Time: Contemporary AA in Vermont. The project will explore the legacy of the fellowship founded by Vermonters Bill Wilson and Dr. Bob Smith through oral histories with contemporary AA members in the state. (\$7,500)
- **Historic Saranac Lake: Prohibition in the Saranac Lake Region.** Historic Saranac Lake will conduct an oral history project to capture and share the stories of Prohibition in the Saranac Lake School District. The findings will inform a mini exhibit in our mobile museum. They will share the exhibit at local events to increase an understanding of our cultural heritage. (\$7,500)
- Clinton County Historical Association: Clinton County Prohibition Era Rum Across the Border Revisited. Through a two room exhibit and a public presentation, this project will document and share the story of the Prohibition Era in Clinton County. (\$7,500)

2021 CVNHP Special Program Grants

- Tourisme Haut-Richelieu: Celebration of Prohibition and commerce in Haut-Richelieu and the Lake Champlain Valley. Tourisme Haut-Richelieu, in partnership with the Musée du Haut-Richelieu and the Fort Saint-Jean Museum, will offer a series of tourist attractions related to prohibition and commerce between Quebec and the United States. A traveling exhibition, a digital tale and a Web series that will focus on the theme of prohibition and commerce. (\$40,000)
- Lake Champlain Maritime Museum: Schooner *Lois McClure* 2021 Tour: Temperance, Prohibition, and Smuggling The *Lois McClure* tour will engage audiences at multiple ports throughout the Lake Champlain Basin, and potentially into the Richelieu corridor, in the history and legacy of temperance, prohibition, and smuggling on Lake Champlain. (\$40,000)
- Lake Champlain Maritime Museum: "Our Best Endeavors": The Legacy of Prohibition in the Champlain Valley. A regional event series examining the history and legacy of Temperance and Prohibition in the Champlain Valley, culminating in a one-day international conference bringing together academics, cultural historians, medical professionals, and business leaders at the University of Vermont. (\$10,000)
